You are invited to join us as we travel to the 111th Annual Convention of Rotary International in Honolulu, USA from June 6—June 10, 2020.



Sun., June 14– Kahului, Maui: A surplus of natural splendor and the genuine hospitality of its people have helped to make Maui Hawaii's second most popular island. Explore the fascinating history of the town of Lahaina. Plant yourself on a pristine beach, or play one of the world's most beautiful golf courses. There are a host of shore excursions that you can take from the ship, or ask us about planning a private excursion just for you.



Mon., June 15- Kahului, Maui: A second full day on this beautiful island will allow you to do those things you missed yesterday, or perhaps, a second day on the beach is what you prefer. Wed., June 17- Kona: Kona offers the quintessential Hawaii experience. Sunny, warm weather and crystal blue waters entice visitors to partake in a variety of surfside fun. Snorkel amongst a kaleidoscope of tropical marine life. Take a surfing lesson, kayak trip or head out to some deeper waters for deep sea fishing. Or, perhaps a visit to the black sand beaches or an authentic Kona coffee plantation might pique your interest today.

Thu., June 18- Nawiliwili, Kauai: Named after the Wiliwili trees, which once lined its picturesque harbor, this lovely port of Kaua'i is your gateway to what many believe to be Hawaii's most beautiful island. Today, you will have a variety of excursions from which to choose and explore the island.

Sat., June 20- Honolulu/Depart for home



Thu., June 11 - Honolulu: Today is free to celebrate King Kamehameha Day. Today, is a public holiday, where the Islands celebrate the accomplishments of "Kamehameha the Great." Credited with uniting the Hawaiian Islands in 1810. Festivities include a floral parade through Honolulu finishing in the heart of Waikiki, horse riding competitions and the King Kamehameha Hula Competition. This evening we will hold a Howard Tours reception in Waikiki for our group members.

Fri., June 12 - Circle Island Tour/Polynesian Cultural Center: This morning, we start our adventure by exploring the eastern and windward side of Oah'u, which includes Diamond Head and Blackpoint Lookout, Kahala and Hanauma Bay Lookout, Halona Blow Hole, Pali Lookout, Dole Plantation and the magnificent North Shore beaches before we reach our final destination of the Polynesian Cultural Center. PCC, as it is known, shares the lifestyles, songs, dance and of the Polynesian cultures, including Samoa, Maori, Fiji, Tonga, Tahiti, and of course, Hawai'i. Included in our visit is a small group guided tour through the villages, Ali'i Luau buffet and dinner show and the "Ha: Breath of Life" evening show.
