

From the ancient city of Hoi An, and magic of Angkor Wat, to the vibrancy of Saigon and Hanoi, this trip reveals layers of culture and beauty. We will visit UNESCO heritage sites such as Hue and the magnificent Halong Bay. This trip is ideal for anyone who wants the extraordinary.

Itinerary

Wed., May 08 - Depart from home.

Thu., May 09 - Cross the International Dateline

Fri., May 10 - Arrive in Siem Reap, Cambodia. After entry procedures, a motorcoach transfer is provided to members who arrive the Singapore Airlines group flight. Lunch is provided as a tour service enroute to our accommodations at the **Sofitel Angkor Phokeethra Resort**, which include daily breakfasts. Afternoon free to enjoy the resort and rest following our long day of travel.

Sat., May 11 – Siem Reap/Ankor Wat: Our full day of sightseeing begins with an early morning to visit **Angkor Wat**, one of the modern wonders of the world. Learn how the Khmer Empire prospered between the 9th and 13th centuries. Lunch is provided, after which we continue sightseeing at **Angkor Thom**, the ancient royal city of Khmer Empire with its centrepiece the Banyon temple. This evening we gather for a welcome dinner.

Sun., May 12 - Siem Reap/Ankor Wat/Hanoi: Today we start with the Roulous temple group. The ruins are among the oldest Khmer monuments in the area, dating back to the 9th century. There are three key Hindu structures that remain at Roulous; Lolei, Bakong and Preah Ko, which were all part of the ancient city of Hariharalaya. Lunch is provided, after which, we drive to the airport for our group flight to Hanoi. After entry procedures, motorcoach transfer provided to our accommodations at the *Movenpick Hanoi Hotel*, which includes daily breakfasts.

Mon., May 13 – Hanoi: Today's sightseeing offers an overview about Hanoi culture and history. We will see the Temple of Literature, West Lake, and Tran Quoc Pagoda, etc. Lunch is provided, after which we

visit Hoan Kiem Lake, Ngoc Son temple, etc. Return to the hotel for free time at leisure. This evening, dinner is provided as a tour service.

Tue., May 14 – Hanoi: Morning visit to the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, One Pillar Pagoda, Hoa Lo prison which was used by the French between 1896-1954 to imprison Vietnamese political prisoners before it housed American POWs, and the old quarter of Hanoi, etc. Lunch is provided. Free afternoon. This evening we witness a performance of the famous Vietnamese Water Puppets, followed by dinner.



Wed., May 15 – Hanoi/ Ha Long Bay: Morning departure for Halong Bay, an extraordinarily beautiful UNESCO World Heritage site. Upon arrival, we will board an Au Co Cruise boat to spend two days and one night exploring the beauty and culture of the bay. Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are included with our accommodation. All cabins have private baths.

Thu., May 16 – Halong Bay/Hanoi/Hue: This morning we continue with our cruise, before we dock and transfer back to Hanoi for a group flight to Hue. Upon our arrival in Hue, we are transferred to our *Melia Vinpearl Hue* accommodations, which includes daily buffet breakfasts.

Fri., May 17 - Hue: Morning sightseeing at the Citadel, Purple Royal Palaces, etc. Lunch provided. Afternoon free. Dinner is included as a tour service.

Sat., May 18 – Hue/Hoi An: Depart by private boat for travel down the Perfumed River to visit Thien Mu Pagoda and the mausoleum of King Minh Mang. We then continue our travels by motorcoach across Cloudy Pass. Lunch is provided. Resort accommodations at the **Boutique Hoi An Resort**, which includes daily breakfasts. Evening Free.

Sun., May 19 - Hoi An: Morning city sightseeing in Hoi An. This World Heritage ancient town is recognized for its well-preserved architecture and pedestrian-only streets. Our tour includes exploring the precious shops, temples, and sites of this historical village. Lunch provided as a tour service. Free afternoon. Dinner included as a tour service.



Mon., **May 20 – Hoi An:** Free day for relaxation and personal enjoyment of the resort. A special outdoor dinner event at the hotel is included.

Tue., May 21 - Hoi An/Da Nang/Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon): This morning our group flight flies to Saigon. Upon arrival, lunch is provided before we begin our exploration by visiting the Notre Dame Cathedral, Central Post Office, Presidential Palace, etc. Our accommodations are at the *Caravelle Hotel*, which includes daily breakfasts. Sun., May 12 - Cross the International Dateline.

Mon., May 13 – Arrive in Bangkok, Thailand. Afternoon arrival in Bangkok on Singapore Airlines. After entry procedures, we will provide a motorcoach transfer provided to our accommodations at the **Shangri-La Bangkok**, which includes daily breakfasts. This afternoon and evening are free for rest from a long flight.

Tue., May 14 – Bangkok: This morning, we begin our exploration of this exciting city. Sightseeing includes the Royal Palace, Wat Traimit and Wat Pho, the Grand Palace complex, Emerald Buddha Temple, etc. This afternoon is free for individual exploration and shopping. Our hotel is located near the MRT (Metropolitan Rapid Transit) station, which gives you quick access to all parts of Bangkok. This evening, we take boats across the Chao Phraya river for a dinner show at the fabled Sala Rim Naam restaurant.

Wed., May 15 – Bangkok: This morning, our exploration takes us to the Railway Market to witness the train running through the heart of the market while vendors move their goods away from the tracks. From there we travel through the beautiful countryside to the Damnern Saduak Floating Market. This afternoon is free for individual exploration and enjoyment. This evening, we will enjoy a dinner cruise on the Chao Phraya River, the "River of Kings."



Thu., May 16 – Bangkok/Chiang Rai: This morning, we fly to Chiang Rai. Upon our arrival we will enjoy lunch before we arrive at our accommodations at **The Riverie by Katathani**, which include daily breakfasts. Balance of the afternoon is free for your personal enjoyment.

Fri., May 17 - Chiang Rai (Golden Triangle): Today is a special, all-day, trip through the Golden Triangle of Thailand, including visits to Akha and Yao hill tribes, the ruins at Chiang Saen, Mae Sai Market, etc. Lunch will be provided as a tour service. Land Only prices include flights between the cities visited as needed. The following information specifies, by tour, which airfares within Asia are included in our "land only" prices.

Pre-Convention Tours Include the following flights in the Land Only Price:

- **Thailand**: Flights from Bangkok to Chiang Rai and Chiang Mai to Phuket are included in the Land Only Price.
- **Vietnam and Cambodia:** Flights from Siem Reap to Hanoi, Hanoi to Hue, and Hoi An to Saigon are included in the Land Only Price.

Post-Convention Tours Include the following flights in the Land Only Price:

- Bali/Komodo: Roundtrip Flights from Denpasar to Labuan Bajo are included in the Land Only Price.
- Japan: No intra-country flights are needed/included
- Malaysia: No intra-country flights are needed/included

Howard Tours can include Trans-Pacific Group Airfare in your booking.

For each tour, we have quoted a roundtrip, economy class airfare, from the West Coast which includes two components – the base fare, which is guaranteed, and the associated and required government security/tourism/airport/international transportation taxes and fees, and fuel surcharges dictated by the airlines. Howard Tours does not and cannot control any changes to these charges. The taxes and fee fees quoted are accurate at the time that this tour brochure was published. The amount each traveler will pay is the amount that is required to be charged by the airline at the time your air ticket is purchased. Howard Tours will provide you an itemization of any changes in the taxes and fees when we send your invoice to you approximately 90 days prior to departure.

Howard Tours will provide group transfers airport/hotel for tour members who purchase our tour flights. Airport/hotel transfers for members who arrive on different flights are NOT included in our tour prices. Airport transfers in Singapore are NOT included in our tour prices as the convention organizers will help attendees with these hotels.





Visa Requirements for US and Canadian Citizens

All US and Canadian citizens are required to have a passport with at least 6 months of validity from the last date you are out of country, before expiration. If you are traveling on any of our Pre Convention tours, your passport must be valid until at least, November 30, 2024. If you are traveling on our Post Convention Tours, your passport must be valid until at least, December 9, 2024

All U.S. and Canadian citizens in addition to a valid passport are required to have a **visa to enter Vietnam**, **Cambodia**, **and Indonesia**.

US citizens can travel to Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand and Japan without a visa as long as you can show onward flights within 30 days of your planned arrival. .

Howard Tours will supply additional information visa information once you are confirmed on our program.

Citizens of other countries will need to determine their respective visa requirements.

Convention Registration and Hotels in Singapore

Howard Tours does not include Convention Registration in our tour prices.

By law, Howard Tours cannot and will not use these funds for purposes other than to defray the program costs. While the money is in the bank, Bank of America and NOT Howard Tours, is custodian of the funds. When the travel service companies are paid, Howard Tours will have met its financial and trustee obligations for the travel services involved.

Per Person Prices Include: (1) Double occupancy hotel accommodations; (2) Meals, cruises and special events as specified in itinerary; (3) Private, guided motorcoach sightseeing with English speaking guide; (4) Entrance fees; (5) Tips to local guides and tour hotel porters; (6) Other values as detailed in the itinerary.
